



## Samuel Lucas JMI PE & Sports Funding 2018/2019

### **What is the PE and Sport Premium?**

The government is spending over £450 million on improving Physical Education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The funding must be used to fund improvements to the provision of PE and sport, so they develop healthy lifestyles.

### **PE Vision**

At Samuel Lucas we believe that physical education is an essential part of a child's educational development. We have developed a balanced programme offering a variety of activities to enhance skills in physical education. Positive participation in physical education will enable children to build self-esteem, teamwork and positive attitudes. We aim to:

- develop confidence, skills and knowledge
- strive for excellence in a positive manner
- be proud of achievements
- promote fair play and respect
- educate children to improve health and wellbeing
- provide quality opportunities for children outside of school time
- give children an opportunity to become a sports leader

This year the school has appointed a full time Sports Coach to lead and develop the PE curriculum. This appointment will enhance the school's involvement in sporting competition and raise the profile in PE and healthy living. The school will be striving to achieve the gold School Games Mark award this year.

The sports committee was formed last year and continues this year with newly appointed children. Sports leaders from year 5 and year 6 are in place to organise scoring and refereeing of the inter-house sports competitions. These are being held every half term. The competitions this year will include football, indoor athletics, netball, tennis and cricket.

The children will participate in the external cross country competition, football and netball league matches and tournaments, cricket competition, tag rugby festival, indoor and outdoor athletics competitions as well as the NSHPP Olympic Legacy.

Children are continued to be encouraged to wear training shoes at break times and try out new resources in the playground. Every week there will be a "Craze of the Week", e.g. badminton and dance. Resources will be purchased to supplement new activities. Every class, every day will go out to run, jog or walk a mile within the school grounds.

Every Friday morning the Headteacher along with a Teaching Assistant host a free 30 minute running club at 8am for children in Year 5 and in Year 6.

Teaching staff will engage once again with an external PE consultant appointed to come in and provide training in dance.

## Swimming

The sports premium funding cannot be used to teach the minimum requirements of the national curriculum including those specified for swimming, however we do need to report the following in regards to our current year 6 cohort:

24 out of 30 children are able to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres and are able to use a range of strokes effectively. More than 50% are able to perform safe self-rescue.

Samuel Lucas expects to receive £19,020 for the academic year 2018-2019. Below is an outline of how we plan to spend the Sports Premium Grant:
