

Children with 5 stars before half term are entered into a raffle to win a book! Good luck and keep reading!






Samuel Lucas Reading Events

Key Stage 1: I Want My Hat Back Jon Klassen A simple story of a bear who has lost his hat! Try changing your voice for all the different characters bear meets and asks if they have seen his hat. The ending has a cheeky twist!



Key Stage 2: The Girl who Speaks Bear Sophie Anderson An exciting adventure and magical tale of a girl who wants to find out about her past and ultimately make a decision about where she feels she belongs. This story encompasses friendship, loss and love.

Libraries – Have you ever been to your local library?

Next time you're passing, pop in and take a look. It's free to get a library card and you can usually take up to around 10 books out at a time. You don't know what you're missing until you've been in – there's something to entice everyone!

Reading Well Library Initiative

. Reading Well for Children is a collection of books to help parents and carers to discuss difficult issues with their children.

The books cover general information and advice about: • maintaining good mental health and wellbeing • understanding and managing feelings • dealing with worries • navigating the world around you, including at school, online and in the news • dealing with tough times, including when someone dies, trauma, and when a parent or carer has mental health needs • support for living well with specific diagnosed conditions including Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD), Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD) and physical disabilities.

The books are free to borrow and are available on the open shelves of local public libraries. The booklist is targeted at children in Key Stage 2 (aged 7-11) and includes a wide range of reading levels to support less confident readers, and to encourage children to read together with their siblings and carers.

Black History Month

Picture books can be impressive and effective tools to help teach young children about both history and modern-day life. What's more, they tell important stories in straightforward, yet gentle ways that open kids eyes to the world around them.
