

Individual lessons are offered to pupils in Year 3 and upwards via Hertfordshire Music Service in the following instruments: Piano, Guitar, Brass, Cello, and Violin (please note, violin lessons are offered for pupils in Year 2 upwards).



If your child is interested in learning an instrument, you will now need to register with Herts Music Service directly at www.hertsmusicservice.org.uk/registeronline to apply for lessons or to join the waiting list, as the waiting list is no longer held by the school.

If you are in receipt of benefits you may be able to receive either 50% or full remission for music lesson fees. Details are available on the Herts Music Service website.



Sports Update

Physical Education

EYFS – We continue to develop our fundamental movements in PE and in the past few weeks have introduced the concept of object control to the children. This has included using equipment such as rackets, bats, table tennis paddles, noodles, tennis balls, bean bags, balloons, table tennis balls and scarves.

Year 1 – After finishing our gymnastics unit (which finished with including some Year 2 work around linking) we have started our new topic of dance. The theme for dance is zoo animals which links with the children's animal work across the curriculum in Art, Science, English and Geography. We have created movements for big and small animals as well as looking at expression and forming a sequence.

Year 2 – Following the completion of our gymnastics work on pathways, Year 2 have also started their dance work in PE. The theme is Explorers which has included creating movements for our journey, explorer and animals, working in canon/unison with a partner, maintaining a character and using emotion and expression in our sequences.

Year 3 – Have also been working through a unit of dance which is weather themed. We have created movements for thunderstorms, extreme weather and a day at the beach so far whilst exploring timing our movements to the music and how we can add drama to our sequences.

Year 4 – We have completed our dance unit which was themed around space and the interaction between an astronaut and an alien. The children have now started working on their tennis skills where we are looking at developing our forehand technique.

Year 5 – Have finished their dance unit which was themed around the Greeks and the ancient Olympics. We have now started Orienteering which will enable us to develop our map reading and route planning skills along with skills such as resilience, teamwork and determination.

Year 6 – We have finished our gymnastics work which focused on matching and mirroring balances, shapes, movements and sequences. The children have now started working on a unit of tennis where we are recapping our skills and knowledge from year 5 with a series of mini games that also consolidate our knowledge of scoring and umpiring.

School Sport

Football – we have had a variety of fixtures across the half term with year 5 and 6 fixtures against Whitehill, St.Mary's juniors and year 4 fixtures against Mary Exton. Lots of children representing the school in the correct manner and enjoying playing football.

Well done to our A team footballers who have won every league game this season finishing in 1st place and will play in the League Playoff final after Easter to determine the overall winner.

The A and B end of season rallies were unfortunately postponed due to the recent wet weather and we are awaiting rescheduled dates.

Netball – the Netball league has finished with fixtures against St.Andrews where the children persisted well in two tough fixtures. We are awaiting the final league table to see where we have finished. The end of season rallies were unfortunately postponed and rescheduled for after Easter. A special thank you must go to Mrs.McNish for all of her support and help coaching the children and umpiring matches this year.

Football - Wix Cup/Girls End of Season Rally

We had mixed fortunes in the two Wix cup finals which were played in the past few weeks.

On Friday evening (17th March) we travelled to Highover for the Girls Wix Cup Final. Having already faced them twice this season we knew it was going to be a tough, tense and exciting game and this occasion proved to be no different.

In a very nervy and end to end game the girls set out to play and compete in the manner they have all year. They were hard working, showed resilience and determination when they had to through some solid defending and took the opportunities to play the football they have played all year.
